## Simple Future Tense Worksheet With Answers

Before going directly into the Simple Future tense worksheet, it might be a good idea first to understand **What is Simple Future Tense in brief?**

### Simple future Tense | Future indefinite tense



The simple future tense is used to discuss an action that will happen in the future. **It is also known as the future indefinite tense.**

In simple future tense, we use the helping verb 'will' before the base form of the verb.

### **For example:**

"I will eat lunch at noon."

Here, "will" is the helping verb, and "eat" is the base form of the verb.

### **Here are a few more examples:**

- She will go to school tomorrow.
- He will play football in the evening.
- They will visit their grandparents next weekend.

In all these sentences, we are discussing something that has not happened yet but will happen in the future.

## Sentence Formation

To form sentences in the simple future tense, we use the helping verb “will” followed by the base form of the verb. The base form of the verb is the same as the infinitive form of the verb, without the word “to”.

**The structure of a sentence in the simple future tense is as follows:**

**Subject + will + base form of the verb + object (if applicable)**

**For example:**

- Subject: I, Verb: go
  - I will go to the park tomorrow.
- Subject: They, Verb: eat
  - They will eat pizza for dinner tonight.
- Subject: She, Verb: study
  - She will study for her exam next week.

It's important to note that when using the simple future tense, we only use the helping verb “will” for most verbs. However, for some irregular verbs like “to be”, we use the helping verb “will” followed by the base form of the verb “be”.

**For example:**

- Subject: He, Verb: be
  - He will be at home later today.
- Subject: We, Verb: be
  - We will be on vacation next month.

## Simple Future Tense Worksheet Solutions

- **Question 1: Rewrite the following sentences in the future indefinite tense**

1. She **will eat** dinner at the restaurant tomorrow.

**Explanation:** The original sentence is about a future event, so we can use the future indefinite tense by replacing “is going to” with “will.” Therefore, the sentence becomes “She will eat dinner at the restaurant tomorrow.”

2. They **will watch** a movie tonight.

**Explanation:** By using the future indefinite tense, we replace “are watching” with “will watch.” Thus, the sentence becomes “They will watch a movie tonight.”

3. We **will go** on a road trip next summer.

**Explanation:** In order to express a future plan, we change “are going” to “will go.” Hence, the sentence becomes “We will go on a road trip next summer.”

4. He **will start** his new job next week.

**Explanation:** To indicate a future action, we replace “is starting” with “will start.” Thus, the sentence becomes “He will start his new job next week.”

5. I **will buy** a new laptop next month.

**Explanation:** By using the future indefinite tense, we change “am buying” to “will buy.” Hence, the sentence becomes “I will buy a new laptop next month.”

6. The train **will leave** the station at 8 o'clock.

**Explanation:** In order to express a future action, we replace “is leaving” with “will leave.” Thus, the sentence becomes “The train will leave the station at 8 o'clock.”

7. They **will meet** their friends for lunch tomorrow.

**Explanation:** By using the future indefinite tense, we change “are meeting” to “will meet.” Hence, the sentence becomes “They will meet their friends for lunch tomorrow.”

8. She **is going to visit** her family during the holidays.

**Explanation:** The original sentence is already in the future indefinite tense, using the phrase “is going to.” Therefore, no changes are needed. The sentence remains “She is going to visit her family during the holidays.”

9. We **will have** a barbecue party this weekend.

**Explanation:** To indicate a future event, we keep “will have” as it is, as it already expresses the future indefinite tense. Thus, the sentence remains “We will have a barbecue party this weekend.”
